



Code of Behaviour for Administrators

Be impartial, consistent, objective and courteous.

Place the safety and welfare of the athletes above all else.

Avoid situations which may lead to a conflict of interest, both in and outside of the office and training facilities.

Condemn all instances of unsporting or unfair behaviour.

Set a good example by the way you dress, speak, and act towards athletes, coaches, officials, judges, parents and spectators.

Show concern and caution towards sick and injured athletes.

Officiate to the age and/or experience of the athletes.

Give all young people equal opportunities to participate.

Provide high quality supervision and instruction for all athletes.

Help coaches, judges and officials highlight appropriate behaviour and skill development and help improve the standards of coaching and judging.



Code of Behaviour for Officials

Compliment and encourage all participants.

Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.

Condemn unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all opponents.

Emphasise the spirit of the competition rather than the errors.

Encourage and promote rule changes that will make participation more enjoyable.

Be a good sport yourself. Actions speak louder than words.

Keep up to date with the latest trends in officiating and the principles of growth and development of young people.

Remember, you set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be supportive and constructive.

Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.

Give all young people a 'fair go' regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Keep all results and athlete details confidential in line with the club privacy policy.
